



Tollerton Community Plan

Priority Area Actions 2018 - 20

Priority Area A - The Village Centre

- Review community meeting space
- Commission study of demand and use of retail space
- Commission landscape & architecture plan for redesign of village centre
- Consult with residents on future plans for village centre
- Identify potential solutions to parking issues and parking on grass verges on Burnside Grove

Priority Area B - The Old Village

- Deliver war memorial site improvements in keeping with red brick character of old village and red rose/poppy/tulip planting scheme
- Support St Peter's Church to plan for long term future and/or improvements to the Church, Church Centre and Scout Hut sites
- Explore opportunities to protect and bring ownership or management of the Tollerton lane 'Albert Ball' allotments within the community

Priority Area C - The Open Space

- Develop the Active Tollerton project and bring forward proposals for improvements to the Open Space, playground and changing rooms
- Improve access including remodelling and underlaying the Lothian Road gates, new signage and cycle and scooter parking facilities
- Identify options to unlock and increase community use of land for community orchard and/or allotments

Priority Areas D and E - Village and Parish Boundaries and Airport Site

- Support development of a heritage strategy to protect pillboxes
- Identify potential sites for community orchards/allotments
- Support development of a robust boundary of enhanced green infrastructure to north of the village and explore options for Country Park
- Develop proposals to expand footpath network to create circular routes around Tollerton; a multi-use cycle and walking link from the village centre to the Grantham Canal along the Polsner Brook; and routes to neighbouring communities including exploring use of the railway line

Parish Council Additional Priorities

- Achieve the Local Council Award (Foundation) and qualify to use the 'general power of competence'
- Review and renovate Council assets to a good standard
